Tutorial: The Middle East in the Popular Imagination

Goals:

The goal of the tutorial is to provide you the basic skills needed for success at Grinnell College. These include:

- 1. reading critically,
- 2. writing well-organized pieces in the style required by the specific assignment with no or few technical errors,
- 3. paraphrasing and citing sources appropriately,
- 4. using the library and internet to find source materials and assessing their usefulness,
- 5. considering other possible sources and types of information, including original data,
- 6. participating effectively in class discussions, and
- 7. giving formal presentations.

Along the way, we will do some exploration of the way the Middle East has been portrayed in the popular media! Obviously, this is an ambitious agenda and you will continue perfecting all of these skills during your entire Grinnell education.
