#### INTRODUCTION

The 2006 comprehensive Report on Admission at Grinnell College is posted on the Dean of the College's website and is available in hard copy to anyone upon request. It is prepared and distributed in the College tradition of full disclosure and allows the entire campus community the opportunity to learn a great deal about College admission. Information regarding the admission process and policies is also made public via periodic faculty meetings, the admission website, and published meeting minutes and annual summaries of the Faculty-Student Committee on Admission and Financial Aid. Finally, the entire enrollment division (admission and financial aid) staff and I are available to respond to your inquiries. Here are highlights of the Report for your consideration.

The new class enrolled this fall showed the following positive characteristics:

- 1. Second largest number of new students of color (19%) in College history and slightly second only to last year,
- 2. An increased yield (number of enrolled students vs. number admitted) of more than 1% and the highest percentage since 2000,
- 3. Largest number of Early Decision applicants ever,
- 4. Excellent gender balance (about 51% female) and the best since 1990,
- 5. Decreased percentage of new students receiving need-based College cash (86%) assistance, and
- 6. Decreased percentage of new students receiving College academic merit scholarships.

#### Other interesting highlights:

- 1. 74% of new students graduated from public secondary schools.
- 2. Biology, English and political science (in that order) are again the most popular intended majors (same as in 2005),
- 3. The number of applications for admission was even after several years of rapid growth,
- 4. Of the 13 states sending more new students, eight are in the South and West and four are in the Midwest,
- 5. Fifty-two percent of new students are from the Midwest (up) and 12% are from lowa (up),
- 6. The most popular co-curricular activities prior to enrollment at the College are (in order of popularity) community service, music and varsity sports,
- 7. The number of new international students is six fewer than the 10-year average of 44,
- 8. The median SAT is down and down slightly below the national decrease,
- 9. The median ACT is even with 2005.
- 10. The secondary school academic performance of new students (as measured by class rank) is slightly below that of 2005, and

11. The amount of College cash, work and loan aid to new students increased very significantly.

Lastly, I want to thank the many students, alumni, staff, and professors who helped make this another marvelously successful enrollment year. Rarely did I ask an office, department or individual for admission assistance and not receive a positive response. On-campus personnel contributed hundreds of volunteer hours in many ways, both in Grinnell and elsewhere, to help build an especially gifted, talented, interesting and well-matched Class of 2010. As with all seven of the Reports with which I have been involved, Connie Newport, an important administrator at the College, earns special commendation for again preparing the data contained in this Report.







## ILLUSTRATION D STUDENTS ENROLLED BY GEOGRAPHIC REGION (HOME STATE)






